News of Members

Here is where sail school can take you:

Mark.

I took the sailing course at the Regina Sailing Club (LMLSC) in 2003 and sailed often there that summer. In 2004 I bought a Hobie Catamaran. On May 15, 2006 I will take on a full-time role as Executive Director of the Sail

and Life Training Society (SALTS) in Victoria, BC! I will give administrative leadership to the organization, which operates two "tall ship" sailing vessels and takes over 2000 young people sailing each year in the waters off Vancouver Island, and on off-shore trips around the world.

From June 2007 to June 2008, one of the vessels will sail to Honolulu, Fiji, Japan, China, and back. Young people aged 13-25 are able to sign up for one or more legs of the off-shore trip, once registrations begins in June 2006.

Each of the two ships has a crew of five and about 30 trainees that live on board during each trip. Both ships were built by hand by SALTS staff and volunteers, and the organization builds and repairs boats of all kinds in their shipyard. My family and I move from Moose Jaw to Victoria next week (May 5). Details on SALTS are at www.salts.ca

Just thought you might like to hear about a Regina Sailing Club alumnus that is going places--quite literally! I'm thankful to your sailing club for getting me started on what has now become my full-time pursuit.
